# OPEN LETTER

TO: The Citizens of Cuyahoga County

The Honorable Thomas Moyer Chief Justice, Supreme Court of Ohio

The Honorable Jimmy Dimora, Peter Lawson Jones and Tim McCormack Commissioners of Cuyahoga County

The Honorable Geno Natalucci-Persichetti Director, Ohio Department of Youth Services

As the Cuyahoga County Court of Common Pleas Juvenile Division begins its Centennial Celebration and enters its second century of service, I am pleased to report that our Court is moving in a positive direction on many fronts.

The year 2001 brought our nation together in a time of national crisis. Because of the tragic events of the year, we were, if anything, even more conscious of the important issues concerning our youth here in Cuyahoga County.

Perhaps at no time in the history of the Juvenile Court have there been more challenges to responding effectively to its stated mission "to administer justice, rehabilitate juveniles, support and strengthen families, and promote public safety". The demands of fiscal responsibility, effective program development, and docket management were met in many innovative and successful ways through the extraordinary efforts of a talented and dedicated staff.

In March of 2001, the Juvenile Court received the final report of the Performance Audit. This report, completed by the office of the Ohio State Auditor at the request of the Juvenile Court, provided a road map to excellence in case management and overall Court management. In only eight months, the Court implemented forty-four or 25% of the audit's recommendations affecting all departments of court operations.

Building on the accurate and reliable data resulting from the implementation of the JIMS (Juvenile Information Management System) software in 2000, the Court now prepares the most accurate and complete Ohio Supreme Court Statistical Reports in its history. In addition, a Program Planning and Evaluation Unit was established. This unit utilizes JIMS data and direct vendor audits to ensure consistent and timely delivery of services for our youth and families.

For too long, the docket of paternity establishment and support cases was unable to meet the current demands of the caseload. I am most pleased to report that, as a result of our Child Support Enforcement Project, and with the full cooperation of the Child Support Enforcement Agency and the County Prosecutor's Office, our paternity establishment docket now has a disposition rate of 144% - the most efficient docket of the entire court.

The Juvenile Court also experienced continued success in our Community Diversion Program which expanded to additional communities in Cuyahoga County and served a record 2200 youth in 2001. Targeted as a Cuyahoga County Comprehensive Strategy goal in 2002, our hope is to expand this highly successful program to all 57 communities within the county.

In further implementation of the recommendations of Comprehensive Strategy, the Court proposed and planning has begun for the creation of a Youth Services Coordinating Council, which will promote a coordinated, countywide effort designed to address prevention, intervention and intensive treatment services across all systems for the benefit of children and families in Cuyahoga County.

Our Juvenile Drug Court has grown steadily and continues to deliver intensive drug treatment counseling to many needy youth. Recognition of the quality of our Drug Court came in the form of an invitation by the

National Drug Court Institute to participate on the Federal Drug Court Peer Review Committee to advise and comment on a variety of "best practices" in this emerging field. Building on this success, a family Drug Court was established to include abuse, neglect and dependency cases.

Commitment to the development of best practices also resulted in the establishment of an Evening Reporting Program for pre-adjudicated youth. Derived from a model in Cook County (Chicago) Illinois, this alternative to shelter care residential services has proven to be a highly successful and far less costly alternative to traditional shelter care. A fifty- percent expansion of capacity is planned for 2002.

The year 2001 required diligent effort to spend limited dollars wisely. In addition to the Evening Reporting Program, the Court partnered with the Cleveland Bar Association to establish a successful truancy mediation project in several area schools at no cost to the Court. A further effort to address budget constraints is evidenced by the reduction, at year's end, of average daily residential placements by 44% and shelter care by 30%.

To better fulfill our mission of protecting abused, neglected and dependent children, the Court has begun meeting with local community leaders to establish a CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) Program in Cuyahoga County.

Looking forward, the Court's facility design team completed a draft functional program plan for the future Youth Intervention Center. Design competition, conducted over the summer, resulted in the awarding of an architectural contract to the Ralph Tyler Companies for the construction of the Intervention Center – a major step forward in the quest to deliver multiple services to youth and families in a comprehensive, efficient and effective manner.

The Court began negotiating with The Service Employees International Union, Local 47, for a bargaining unit encompassing probation officers, transportation officers, process servers and clerks. When this contract is executed, Cuyahoga County Juvenile Court will be the first Juvenile Court in the State of Ohio with both Detention Officers and Courtside employees under a Union Contract.

Along with this report of these achievements, I hereby submit, in compliance with the Ohio Revised Code Section 2151.18, the 2001 Annual Report of the Cuyahoga County Juvenile Court concerning the number and kinds of cases before it, their dispositions, and other data pertaining to the work of the Court.

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


